FROM THE PRINCIPAL

MASKS

Last week saw the introduction of mask-wearing while indoors for our students in Year 3-6 and I would like to thank everyone for the amazing way students have adjusted so quickly to this change. We have taken a reasonable and supportive approach to this mandate and have worked with students as needed while they adjust to the new normal. A key factor in this change has been the positive support from parents as we all do our bit to stay healthy in these COVID times.

The introduction of masks is aimed at significantly reducing the likelihood that whole classes would be required to isolate in the event of a student or teacher being unknowingly infectious with COVID while at school. This is a welcome measure, and it has been great to see many of our Year 2 students also wearing a mask while at school across all three Year 2/3 classes.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT

Our whole school approach to behaviour management is PBS and defined by our CARE values of Cooperate, Aspire, Respect and Excel. This term we are focusing on the value of cooperation and what this looks like in school. Students are explicitly taught the expected behaviours within our school matrix, and these are then positively reinforced using a range of systems in classrooms and through our whole school token collection. Our new faction token houses are filling up fast!

All factions are currently working towards a reward that fits within current COVID guidelines, and next term students will vote in their faction groups as to which rewards they will work towards throughout the term. Student voice is an essential component and increases motivation and ownership.

Our much-anticipated CARE Term 1 community breakfast will be on hold for the moment, however we will still recognise the importance of this approach to our school through a CARE colour day towards the end of the term.

ATTENDANCE

Every day matters and a regular school attendance career provides students with the optimal foundations for success, progress and achievements. Even one day away from school per fortnight interrupts the learning process as students miss vital explicit teaching and the opportunity to practice new skills and understandings, reinforcing their knowledge. While it is important to be cautious in our current climate and keep children at home if they are unwell, if your child is well they should be at school on time every day.

At the end of last week notes were sent home requesting explanations for unexplained student absences for the first six weeks of the term. Please complete and return as soon as possible. Additionally, letters identifying students who have attendance rates in the 'at risk' categories will also be coming home this week.

This year we will acknowledge and reward regular attendance through a number of initiatives and continue to encourage high attendance rates. Watch out for regular updates and the presentation of each term's attendance incentive. It is important to note, that absences due to class closures or students who are required to isolate according the Health Department guidelines, will not have these days included in attendance percentage calculations for rewards and incentives.

HOME READING - KAPER

At EHHPS we recognise the importance of reading every day. Each student has a home reading tracking system (KAPER) that supports students and parents to practise reading mastery at home. Reading books that are selected by teachers and sent home are aimed at a level of independence, allowing students to master the skills explicitly taught at school. Listening to your child read each night should be a positive part of home routines, and supports all students to become confident and capable readers. In addition to this structure, students are encouraged to read in class when they are ready for the day after the classroom doors open at 8:30am. These 20 minutes are valuable, and we encourage all students to be at school on time so as not to miss this part of the day. If you have any questions regarding home reading or reading books, please contact your child's teacher.

PARENT SURVEY

Tell Them From Me® (TTFM) is a suite of surveys for measuring student engagement and wellbeing. The surveys capture student, parent and teacher voices, providing reliable evidence for schools to use in identifying strengths and areas for improvement. The TTFM Parent Survey helps to clarify and strengthen the important relationship between parents and our school. Insights into parent and staff communication, activities and practices at home, and parental opinions build an accurate and timely picture that can inform our planning. The survey is anonymous, voluntary, and easy-to-use. It is based on a comprehensive questionnaire covering several aspects of the parents' perceptions of their child's experiences at home and school. MUESLI BARS - A LUNCHBOX STAPLE

The muesli and fruit bar aisle of any supermarket can be a minefield, many bars are energy dense and provide very little nutritional value. Here are some tips to help you make a healthier choice:

- o Avoid bars that are dipped in chocolate or contain choc chips
- o Avoid bars that contain confectionary i.e. those topped with 'yoghurt'
- o Look for a bar that contains fruit rather than just cereals
- Avoid fruit leather or straps these are no good for children's teeth – choose a piece of fruit instead
- o Restrict muesli bars to once a week as a treat.

Did you know eggs are super nutritious foods? They are a good source of protein, contain most vitamins except C, and are especially a good source of vitamin B12 and to retain nutrients eggs are best stored in the fridge in their cardboard container as it prevents odours entering the eggs.
