REPORTS

On Monday Semester 1 Reports were sent to parents via email link for students in Pre-primary to Year 6. This link has a limited accessibility time-frame so please remember to download and save a copy of your child's report for future reference. ATTENDANCE REWARDS

This term we are celebrating students who have demonstrated regular attendance (90% and above) with a certificate and an entry into a raffle draw. Well done to all students who have maintained regular attendance in Term 2 and to those who have improved their attendance rates recently. During these COVID times and the onset of winter cold and flu season, we have approximately 30 students who have achieved 100% attendance in Term 2! Congratulations to these students!

It is essential to effective learning for students to be at school every day when they are well.

If your child attends school at a 90% rate from Pre-primary to Year 6, they still miss 24 weeks of school (120 days), or just over one semester, throughout their primary school life.

If your child attends school at an **80%** rate from Pre-primary to Year 6, they miss 56 weeks of school (**280 days**), or **5½ terms**, throughout their primary school life.

If your child attends school at an **70%** rate from Pre-primary to Year 6, they miss 84 weeks of school (**420 days**), or more than **2 years**, throughout their primary school life.
