The session, hosted by Craig Beard and Esther Maxwell, gave parents an opportunity to learn more about the Zones of Regulation program. We use zones at school to teach students to identify their emotions and level of escalation and importantly what strategies they can use to regulate their emotions and bring them back into the 'green zone'. We encourage as many families as possible to engage with the zones, as consistency between home and school would be greatly beneficial to our students.
