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

Students were able to meet and pet these awesome animals, and if the smiles were anything to go by, everyone thoroughly enjoyed this incredible learning experience.






























Book Week

ThinkUKnow? Presentation



East Hamilton Hill will be hosting a ThinkUKnow presentation on 28 August at 5pm, and all parents, carers and teachers are encouraged to attend.

ThinkUKnow Australia is an evidence-based education program, developed by the Australian Federal Police and delivered nationally to prevent online child sexual exploitation.

Educational resources are informed by reports to the Australian Centre to Counter Child Exploitation, to ensure content delivered is addressing and responding to current trends seen by law enforcement.

ThinkUKnow Australia is a partnership between the Australian Federal Police, Microsoft Australia, Datacom and the Commonwealth Bank of Australia. The program is delivered in collaboration with Western Australia Police.

The presentation will be delivered by a local law enforcement member and an industry volunteer. The presentation is pro-technology and addresses topics including self-generated child abuse material, online grooming, sexual extortion, and importantly encourages help seeking behaviour.

This is a fantastic opportunity for you to learn more about young people and the online environment, and how you can help them to be safe and responsible users of technology. The canteen operates on Wednesdays and Fridays each week.






