2024 CLASS STRUCTURES

As we plan for the 2024 school year we are excited to see growth in our school, with an additional class being added. This highlights the exceptional work taking place at East Hamilton Hill Primary School and is a credit to our dedicated staff and our wider predicted community. To accommodate our enrolments we will again have some composite (split) classes next year. Composite classes are common in most schools and provide many benefits for students and teachers alike.

This class structure allows for valuable teacher collaboration across the year levels, ensuring consistency of teaching practice from class to class, and opportunities for our students to develop wider social connections across the school. Composite classes also allow us to have smaller student numbers in each class, enabling teachers to provide targeted support to students when needed. Our teachers are all highly skilled and very experienced in teaching composite classes, catering to the individual needs of each student in their class.

As we work hard to develop class lists, we offer all parents the opportunity to provide any educational reasons you feel worth sharing with regard to the placement of your child. These reasons will be taken into consideration when we place students for next year. Whilst there are no guarantees that we can meet your request, we aim to do the best for each child. Please keep these reasons based on their needs as opposed to placement with other students or teachers.

With over 250 students across our school next year, the process is rigorous, takes many weeks and involves input from all teaching staff and the school leadership team. Our priority is to create classroom environments where all students are empowered with the confidence to thrive. If you
