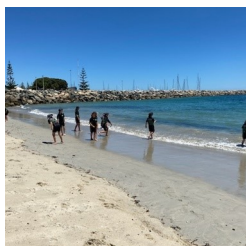

## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome back to a new school year! It has been a hot and busy start to the term; however our students have adapted well and are back in the swing of school. Term One is a short nine-week term, jam packed with events and learning opportunities for our students.

### HOT WEATHER

We have had a unique start to the year, with two heatwaves in two weeks, and more extreme heat forecast for later this week! The health and safety of our staff and students is our priority and as a school we have policies and processes in place to manage the extreme heat.

All classrooms are airconditioned and teachers modify their learning programs to provide students with sufficient breaks to hydrate and opportunities to rest. Our Physical Education program is modified in the instances of extreme heat, or prolonged periods of heat and will take place in the shade or in an airconditioned room. Physical Education classes may be swapped with a Health class in the event of extreme heat, at the discretion of Miss Gabrielson.

During break times students are offered indoor alternatives to play and in the instance of extreme heat, play is limited to indoor learning spaces and the undercover area.

We encourage students to apply sunscreen before school and reapply throughout the day. It is essential that students bring a water bottle that can be used in class and filled regularly throughout the day.

### ICE BREAKER

Our annual Ice Breaker was postponed last week due to the heat and on advice from the Department of Education. The Ice Breaker will now take place on Friday 8 March 2024. We look forward to seeing the school community there.

### GOAL POSTS

Have you seen our new goal posts? Over the holidays we had a set of AFL goal posts installed on the bottom oval. Thanks to our P&C, who with the help of a grant from the City of Cockburn, funded the purchase and installation of the posts. A special thanks also to Pat Clifford for his support in driving this project. These goal posts will have a significant impact on our local community, and our students love them!

### SWIMMING LESSONS

Our Year 3 and 5 students enjoyed a warm week at swimming lessons. With hot days and double lessons, they finished the week tired but happy. Thank you to our amazing staff who supported our students at the pool in the extreme heat, without the bonus of having a swim!

Our next allocation of swimming lessons are coming up in Weeks 7 and 8. More information will be coming home soon to students in Pre Primary, Year 1, 2, 4 and 6.

### EARLY CLOSE

On Thursday 7 March (Week 6) the school will be closing at 11:15am for parent-teacher interviews. Students will still attend school and complete their regular timetable until 11.15am. We request that families seek alternative care arrangements for their children following the 11.15am closure. The aim of this half day is to ensure that all parents have the opportunity to meet with their child's classroom teacher, either face-to-face or over the phone to discuss academic progress, goals and any other matters relating to classroom learning. A letter outlining the details of the day and booking options will come home shortly. The parent teacher meetings are an incredibly valuable time for both parents and teachers and I encourage all parents to book an appointment time with classroom teachers.
