

## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

#### **PUBLIC SCHOOL REVIEW**

Every public school in Western Australia undergoes a Public School Review, providing feedback to the staff and the community on how the school is travelling and self identified areas for improvement. Our Public School Review will be held on Tuesday 25 June, with a visit from two Department of Education representatives. Our staff have been working incredibly hard to prepare evidence for the review at the end of the term. We will be inviting all staff, our student leaders and members of our parent community to speak with the review team on the day and share their thoughts on our school performance.

#### **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

With the cool weather setting in, it is a timely reminder of our school uniform expectations. Wearing the correct school uniform is a school wide CARE expectation (we wear our school uniform and represent East Hamilton Hill Primary School with pride) and plays an important role in fostering a positive learning environment where students have a sense of belonging and school pride. The school uniform consists of either a school dress or a school polo shirt, plain black or school pants and a school jacket. Black leggings and long sleeve tops may be worn as layers under the school uniform. It is important that pants and undershirts are not branded. Students who are not wearing the school uniform will be asked to change into uniforms provided by the school for the duration of the day. New school uniforms can be ordered through the Eclipse website, with delivery to the school every Friday. Your support in ensuring your child wears the correct uniform is greatly appreciated.

#### KINDY ENROLMENTS

Enrolments for Kindergarten 2025 have opened and will close on Friday 19 July 2024. We have already received 17 enrolments which is fantastic! We will be hosting two Kindy meet and greet tours this term for prospective parents to come and view the school. These tours are on Thursday 9 May at 10.00am and Tuesday 11 June at 10.00am. We look forward to welcoming another 40 students to our school in 2025.

#### INDIGENOUS MATERIALS INCURSION 18 APRIL 2024

On Thursday 18 April 2024, the students from Years 2 to 4 had the great fortune of participating in an incursion with Sharyn Egan. These students have been learning about natural materials, their uses and purposes.

Sharyn is an acclaimed West Australian artist and Noongar woman. She shared with us the background of totem animals you are given at birth and how you are to care for that creature and its environment.

Sharyn showed us how to use meadow hay and yarn to wrap the shape of the animal and go back and forth to form the limbs, head and features.

The students did a magnificent job at creating an animal of their choice and reflected upon how they could care for it and its habitat. They asked wonderful questions and were very impressed with Sharyn's works. She is the artist behind the play space at Optus Stadium and the Scarborough foreshore. We are so grateful for this experience!

# Curiosity Club Specialists in Training



Fremantle College's Curiosity Club is an after school program which offers hands-on extension opportunities for students in Year 5.

### Curiosity Club Specialist ICT

The ICT program supports students to develop their design and problem-solving skills, and expand their creativity. They will have access to industry standard technology as they undertake a design and create process, developing a tangible product.

#### Curiosity Club Specialist Marine Science

The Marine Science program encourages students to further their understanding of the marine environment, and the impact we have on it. They will undertake a range of scientific investigations, drawing upon skills in chemistry, physics and biology.

Our Curiosity Club will run for three sessions and take place in Terms 3 and 4. When applying, students are able to select which term they wish to attend, and they are able to apply for both programs. Specialist teaching staff facilitate all sessions, supported by our Specialist Program Student Leaders.

#### Application Process

Students are required to complete the application form and return to Fremantle College by Friday 14 June 2024. Online form is available on our college website, under Enrolments and Curiosity Club. The college will advise the outcome of all applications at the end of Term 3 and distribute information to families.
