LATE ARRIVALS TO SCHOOL

Attendance at school every day gives your child the best opportunity to do well. Being a little late might not seem much but if he/she is only missing just 10 minutes per day then over thirteen years of compulsory schooling that's nearly half a year.

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SCIENCE DAY 14 AUGUST 2024

During National Science Week this year we decided to host a Science Day at EHHPS. A whole day dedicated to practical, hands on experiments. Students from Pre-primary through to Year 6 were mixed into 11 groups, with a few students from each year level going into each group. These groups then moved around the school and completed 11 different activities.

Our students all deserve a huge congratulations on how they conducted themselves. CARE values were demonstrated from everyone. The Year 5 and 6 students showed off their excellent leadership skills in moving the groups around and supporting the younger students, really highlighting the collaborative nature of our community. The feedback about the best part of the day from one of our pre-primary students was, "making new friends".

The experiments!! A connect notice went out after Science Day with a link to download the activities the students participated in. I hope you have found some time to have a go at home with your children. The Walking Water activity would be a great one to set up on the school holidays and see what happens after a few days! The experiments showcased a range of scientific principles, and how accessible the materials are. Everything we used could be found at home and if not sourced from the local shopping centre. Highlights of the day were the vinegar and bicarbonate film canister rockets, the flying teabags, using the microscopes and the elephant toothpaste.

There is still a few weeks left to get entries into the Science Fair ready. Using the Rational Science Week topic, Species Survival: more than just sustainability, student students can make a project, poster, experiment or research to present for Open Night. All entries will be on display in the library and participants will be recognised for their contributions. If your child has been working on something and it hasn't quite turned out the way they wanted, please take photos and bring those in with a little write up. Experiments not working is the biggest catalyst for scientific growth and we celebrate this process part of the process.

We are holding a FREE therapy day where parents can:


