## What is Good Standing?

Good Standing is the status all students at East Hamilton Hill Primary School are granted. This means that they display the whole school Positive Behaviour in School (PBS) expectations and values. Students with Good Standing are eligible to participate in school reward and social activities that are non-curricula. It is the responsibility of each student to maintain their Good Standing.

## Good Standing Policy

At East Hamilton Hill Primary School, the Good Standing Policy works in conjunction with our PBS Policy and support our core values of Cooperate, Aspire, Respect and Excel (CARE) to reward students for displaying positive behaviour. Good Standing emphasises the importance of students taking responsibility for the choices they make which impacts on themselves, their peers and staff. Individual student needs will be taken into consideration, and all cases will be closely monitored according to their specific requirements.

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## Good Standing Procedures

- A student may be referred to the Administration by a teacher for continued minor behaviour breaches or a serious major behaviour breach. These may include;
  - suspensions
  - two or more withdrawals within a five-week period
  - acting outside of the CARE values, in contravention of a Behaviour Management Plan that has been developed between a teacher and the student
- The Principal or Deputy Principal will arrange a Return to Good Standing Plan with the student, discuss the target behaviours and inform classroom teacher and specialist teachers.
- Loss of Good Standing to be entered into Integris by the Administration team.
- Unless there is an in-school suspension, withdrawal or an immediate suspension, the student will return to class.
- The Principal or Deputy Principal will notify the parent/carer if their child has lost their Good Standing.
- The student is ineligible to participate in school reward activities and social and non-curricula activities if they have lost their Good Standing. These include PBS reward days, extra 10 min play, incursions/excursions and camps.

## Redemption of Good Standing

- The student will be placed on a Return to Good Standing Plan for a determined period of time, in consultation with the teacher (not longer than 5 weeks), or until the student has earned their Good Standing back.
- Students will meet with the Principal or Deputy Principal each day/week to check in and discuss the target behaviours and their progress.
- If they breach the target behaviours which have been set, the Loss of Good Standing will be extended.
- When Good Standing is reinstated by the Principal, the student will discuss this with the Principal or Deputy Principal and parents will be notified.
- The Return to Good Standing Plan will be kept in the student's individual file.
- Once Good Standing is reinstated, the child can resume participation in all school activities.
- Losing Good Standing twice will result in a case conference with parents.
